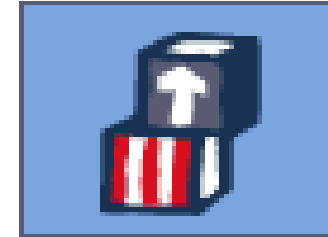

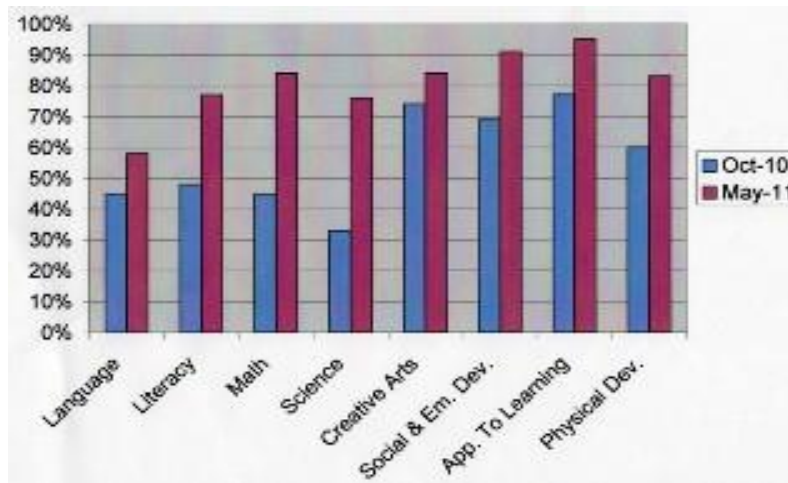
PROGRAM HISTORY

Southwest Human Resource Agency began as Chickasaw Area Development in 1972 and in 1984 became a Human Resource Agency. The Head Start Program began as a summer Head Start Program under Chickasaw Area Development and transitioned into a standard, full year Head Start operating from August to April in 1973. In 1973, the Southwest HRA Head Start program operated nine (9) centers with an enrollment of 320 children. Today, the Southwest HRA Head Start Program operates 17 centers with an enrollment of 579 children in Chester, Decatur, Hardeman, Hardin, Haywood, Henderson, and McNairy Counties. The Program operates an extended care classroom in Haywood, Henderson and McNairy Counties. There is also an extended care classroom in Chester County that is a collaboration classroom with the Chester County Board of Education.

FEDERAL REVIEW AND AUDIT

The Federal Review, conducted March 28th - April 2, 2010, identified one area of non-compliance in *Education and Early Childhood Development*. It concerned the definition of "researched based" curriculum and was technical in nature. The SWHRA Head Start curriculum has been adjusted to comply with the condition of the New Head Start Act. The Annual Audit of the Agency contained no Head Start findings.
